Beth Jay:

- 5 minute: What Happened to the Old Extension?
 - Content Grabber (CG) is a third-party screen scraping tool.
 - Google Chrome Store is changing their plug-in requirements. CG does not meet those new requirements and has been removed by Google.
 - CG takes a snapshot of your screen, converts what you see into a structured file and sends it to Clockwork. Clockwork processes that information the same way it processes any csv import. We will continue to support files/information that we receive from CG.
 - Linkedin seems to have increased their enforcement of their Terms of Use (monitoring and punishing screen scraping activity)
 - A common question we have received is: Why does the "data" look different?
 - Answer. Our Chrome Extension captures data through a legitimate API provider, rather than scraping it directly from LinkedIn.

 This means that certain data points, such as contact info or detailed profiles, may not be available, as LinkedIn controls what data is made accessible through their public API.


Jay Greene:

- ❖ 10 minute: Our Chrome Extension
 - We built our Chrome Extension to provide a similar sourcing experience, without the screen scraping features and with better/more comprehensive data quality. We use 3rd party data providers as data sources for both the Chrome Extension and for enrichment activity in the application. (Nubela/Proxycurl and People Data Labs) (PDL)
 - No violation of LinkedIn Terms of Use.
 - Pros: The data from these sources has better data quality than CG
 - Complete location fields
 - Company details (logo, LI URL fewer duplicates)
 - Position Description
 - Cons: The data for contacts may not reflect what is on their LI profile:
 - Missing Contact info (for 1st degree connections)
 - Missing Images
 - Missing most current position (for recent changes)



Jay Greene:

- Evolution Upcoming Version (release 4/22)
 - Move current position to Header
 - Drag and Drop Image of Contact
 - Add Email and Add Phone
 - Person Icons from Clockwork show on record
 - (DNC, on Projects, etc)
 - Add to Project is Sticky
 - (remembers last selection)
- Future Version
 - Ideas: Add Notes, See All Current Positions, More Contact Info, Contact Summary
 - Requests?
